



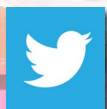
In April, the school was destroyed by earthquakes.

The Marcos Lainez School is a small rural school in the region of Leon that was built in 1965. In April, two earthquakes with magnitudes greater than 6.0 and several aftershocks struck the region. The school was damaged beyond repair with the walls falling out of the structure and the roof having to be removed because it was unsafe. Now the students are attending classes in a nearby home that is still standing. Urgent reconstruction is needed so students can resume classes at their school. SchoolBOX plans to build a new classroom that will be able to withstand earthquakes by using certified engineers and reinforcing every brick.



Most families in this community have informal employment in care giving, farming and other odd jobs. The parents in this community are hopeful that their children will have a proper school again soon so they may continue their studies.
